# Thayne Town Council Meeting September 18, 2019

#### Approval of August 21, 2019 Council Meeting Minutes and the Adoption of the Agenda as finalized.

#### **Public Comments**

- Mr. Cade Roberts approached the Town Council regarding the building permit that he had submitted that was tabled at the August 21, 2019 council meeting. Mayor Simpson stated that the application was not complete. Simpson stated that if Mr. Roberts would drop off building plans to the Town Hall, the application could then be pushed forward through email to the Council Members. Mr. Roberts also asked the Council if the approval for the building permit could be suspended until spring; the permit cannot be suspended but an extension can be filed for at the end of the 18 month period if the work is not completed.
- Cade Roberts mentioned that the sign in front of the Roberts' home was taken down for the installation of the Town of Thayne's new water main and was not correctly put back up. Roberts asked if the contractor for the water line will correctly replace the sign before the project is complete.

#### **Robert Hood-Sunrise Engineering**

- Thayne Storage Tank Project
  - The Town of Thayne has received the fourth pay request from Western Municipal for a total of \$252,378.69 The interior piping on the new tank is nearly complete and the exterior painting on the old tank is finished. The remaining work includes cleaning, disinfection and leakage testing of the new tank and bringing it into service. Taking the old tank off-line to coat the inside and install the new vent and overflow.

- North Waterline Project
  - The Town of Thayne has received the third pay request for \$178,826.20 from Westwood Curtis.
  - The sewer lagoon waterline, Moser waterline and hwy bore are complete. The North waterline is complete from Hemmert to the County Shop. Remaining work includes finishing the north waterline, installing service lines and meter pits and reconnecting customers, paving and cleanup.

#### **Jimmy Stoker**

• The Jimmy Stoker family was in attendance and asked the Town Council what the lots they own on Franklin Street were zoned and what that zone allowed. Mayor Simpson stated that the lots were currently zoned residential which allows single family homes. Mayor Simpson also stated that there has been much discussion on these and surrounding lots. Currently the Town of Thayne is reconstructing the Town Ordinance Book and in the process would like to rezone said lots to AR-2 and rewrite the ordinance for this zone to include duplexes. Mayor Simpson stated that there will be a discussion at a later time which will include the paving of Franklin Street.

• Mayor Simpson gave an update for Councilman Heward on the Thayne Beautification Committee. The Committee has hired a professional tree trimmer that will trim all Town of Thayne Trees within the next three years.

- Mayor Simpson mentioned that he has some concerns with hiring Tim Hale to invest the Town funds. Simpson has been in contact with three other investing companies and will report at a later time.
- Simpson mentioned to the Town Council that he has spoken with the Brett and Debbie Merica and they would like something in writing from the Town of Thayne stating that the AR-2 ordinance will be changed to allow duplexes before their land's zoning is changed. Town attorney Kevin Voyles said that legally the Town cannot. Mayor Simpson then asked the Town Council who is to pave Franklin Street. According to Kevin Voyles, Franklin Street is a Town of Thayne road. The Council agreed to schedule a work session with both Brett and Debbie Merica and Jimmy Stoker to discuss.
- Mayor Simpson informed the Town Council that the DUP has submitted a letter with their resignation from coordinating the Town of Thayne July 4<sup>th</sup> event. Simpson asked the Council members to think of any other groups that would like to help us out with this event.
- Mayor Simpson stated that Dee Aullman contacted him regarding the property just north of Roberts Street. The Aullman's have an investor that would like to develop that property with low income housing. Mr. Aullman is asking the Town of Thayne if they would allow a road to be installed off of Roberts Street on the sewer lagoon property that heads north that would connect to a road that would be installed off of US Hwy 89 that heads west. The Town Council was in agreeance that they would allow the entrance to the sewer lagoon to be used but the Aullman's would then have to install the road on their own property.
